ANSCHÜTZ OPEN

Competitors from Wyoming to Georgia converged upon The X Count on August 15 for the first ever Anschutz Open. The athletes ranged in abilities from experienced national team members to relative newcomers to the sport. Excitement was in the air as

\$7,500 in prizes were up for grabs to the top eight competitors. The coveted top prize was an Anschutz 9015 Precise valued at \$4,200. Interestingly, only three weeks prior, this match was not even a thought.

In July, the rifle shooting community experienced yet another major loss due to COVID. The Walther Cup, scheduled to be held at the University of West Virginia on August 15th was cancelled. Indiana leaders were motivated to spare their constituents the continued disappointment that the loss of such a significant match would bring to the highest level of competitor in Olympic rifle shooting. Walther Cup Founder/Coordinator and West Virginia University coach, John Hammond encouraged Indiana to host a competition, if possible, for the sake of the sport and its competitors.

Match organizers reached out to Anschutz representatives both in the US and Germany to find an alternate match sponsor. Relying on an existing relationship and a recent visit to the factory in Germany to lay the groundwork for such a venture, leaders at The X Count began the planning the Anschutz Open. The German company's only condition was that this would be an annual event and not just a response to COVID.

NRA Advanced Rifle Training Resumes

The Advanced Certified Coach - Level 3 is the highest-level coach certified by the NRA and its coach education partners. The Level 3 Coach has received advanced training and meets the highest requirements that NRA and its coach education partners have established for certification. The Advanced Certified Coach is recognized to coach advanced athletes and is eligible to work at the international level in Junior Olympic Shooting Camps and other USA Shooting sponsored international shooting programs.

It had been several years since the Advanced Coach Course had been offered. Historically it had been taught just prior to the Coach College at the Olympic Training Center. The coach college typically took place biannually but was not held in 2019 due to financial and organizational challenges at USA Shooting. The X Count has been working to fill the gap left by this cancellation for the last several years.

Staff and organizational changes in the NRA's Education and Training department posed a challenge for the implementation of this course but finally with persistence the NRA agreed to allow the course to be taught.

Originally, the course was scheduled for early June but as yet another casualty of COVID, the class had to be rescheduled. Ultimately, the class was able to be conducted, August 7-9. As a significant force in the shooting sports community, Indiana became the most natural place for this to occur. The X Count, a USA Shooting Certified Training Center, was a logical host site. Exceptional staff both local (Gregg Rice – ISSF Licensed Coach) and national (Bob Foth – Olympic Medalist and former US National Team Coach) provided the necessary professional level of instruction for coaches from Wyoming to Mississippi who had been waiting for this course to be offered. All involved noted the success of the program and organizers agreed that this would be the first of many coach training experiences in Indiana.

LEGISLATIVE REPORT

With most attention focused on the presidential election, Hoosier gun owners need to remember 25 Senate seats and 100 House seats in the Indiana General Assembly are up for election as well. Hopefully ISRPA



members have been in contact with candidates in their districts. Various political action groups have graded and/or endorsed candidates who agree with their positions. The National Rifle Association has announced their endorsement of 18 Senate candidates and two thirds ofthe House candidates. Unfortunately, history has shown that sometimes endorsed candidates do not honor the endorsement due to pressure from other political action groups; therefore, it is important that gun owners and supporters of the right to keep and bear stay in touch with their respective legislators. Without a doubt the 2020 presidential is the most important national election in our lifetime. The two major political parties have clearly defined the direction they would take. One is now directed by a radical, socialist group which is attacking not only our right to keep and bear arms, but other rights protected by the Constitution, such as religious freedom and freedom of speech. The X Count Wins First Ever Back-to-Back Monthly Rockstar Recognition By Sue Mogle, Exec. VP

In 2019 the **MidwayUSA Foundation** began a yearlong contest to incentivize fundraising efforts by youth shooting sports teams. The Annual **Rockstar** contest gives sizeable financial incentives to youth shooting teams who have the largest match eligible contributions to their team's trust during a given year.

In 2020 MidwayUSA will award the top five teams a combined total of \$50,000 in incentives by way of a contribution to their endowment accounts. Through generous contributions of Larry and Brenda Potterfield, 100% of donations go directly to the Teams. These Team endowment accounts return funds for operating expenses for the respective youth shooting teams each year. Each month, as a way of keeping teams excited and engaged, the team that has the largest match eligible contribution for the month is given the honor of Monthly Rockstar. This team is featured on the MidwayUSA Foundation blog and given a small financial token to their account. For the first time ever, this July and August, the monthly challenge saw a back to back winner. Congratulations to The X Count (Ft Wayne), the MidwayUSA Foundation Monthly Rockstar for both months!

The X Count gave credit to their local community and the broader shooting sports community, especially state organizations IYSSF and ISRPA for partnering with them in their programming and fundraising efforts. They noted that it was important to always dream of bigger and better things: "Having dreams for the future helps keep things exciting and fresh and keeps constituents engaged in fundraising efforts." reported The X Count's President, Gregg Rice. The X Count relied heavily on the fundraising products offered to teams by the MidwayUSA Foundation to grow their endowment accounts. The Indiana Youth Shooting Sports Foundation and the Indiana shooting community wish the best of luck to all our Indiana youth shooting sports program as we compete for top five ranking in the Annual Rockstar challenge.

2020 ISRPA Across the Course High **Power State Championship Series**

The ISRPA Across the Course State Championship Series is comprised a series of Highpower matches held across Indiana to give shooters a chance to compete in all phases of High Power competition. 100 and 300 Yard Reduced and the Full Course (200-600 yard) Match; the Vintage Sniper and Garand State Championship have been a Highpower Tradition in Indiana for many years. New this year is the Hoosier Home Range Hundred series, a series of 100 yard reduced course matches shot over several weekends at various ranges in Indiana. The brain child of Larry Beardsley of Ft. Wayne Rifle & Revolver, the match series was very well attended. Read the full article elsewhere in this issue of ISSN magazine!

With near perfect weather for the weekend, the 2020 ISRPA State Championship Series concluded September 19-20 with the Across the Course State Championship held at Camp Atterbury. New for this year, the Course State Championship consisted of the 1600 point Aggregate of Saturday and Sunday's Congratulations to Match Winner Sean matches. Pickel! Full match results are posted on the ISRPA website www.isrpa.org.

Also new for 2020 were awards for Individual Aggregates: winners of the Offhand, Rapid Fires, and Prone Slow Fire weekend aggregates received recognition- and \$20. This was our (re)introduction to payouts for the State Championship matches. In the past three years we've brought the CMP KTS targets to Camp Atterbury (2018), purchased our own 10 ISRPA Silver Mountain Targets and built frames and supporting infrastructure (2019), and added 5 targets and frames in 2020. All of this has required a huge investment, and precluded any payouts while we built the ISRPA Course High Power program. We've been careful and lucky building our resources, and as a result are able to begin considering payouts for High Power matches.

Perpetual Trophies for the Highpower State Championship Series are maintained by ISRPA High Power.
