President's Column



I hope that everyone is having an enjoyable and safe summer. As I reflect upon the relaxed days of fishing in a cool stream, napping in the hammock, and playing hooky for a day of sporting clays with the kids, I have to admit that I am enjoying all of the excitement and non-stop activities of the ISRPA.

As I write this article, our work on Constitutional Carry comes to fruition, as it becomes the law of the land July 1st...It coincides with the new Supreme Court ruling, New York State Rifle & Pistol Association v. Bruen...this has been a **BIG** year for protecting our Constitutional Rights. Both landmark achievements demonstrate the incredible importance of State Associations working hand-in-hand with our National Organization, the NRA, to fight the neverending battle to keep freedom more than just an American dream. With victories at the State and Supreme Court levels, we still find ourselves under attack on many other battlefronts. Within hours of the ruling from the High Court, Congress acted with lightning (and reckless) speed with a knee-jerk reaction to the heinous event in Uvalde, Texas. Lightning speed is an understatement. I spoke with Senator Todd Young before the vote on the "Safer Communities Act" and I believe that he was sincere in his approach to pass legislation that was not misguided by nonsensical gun control measures, however, the legislation set a very dangerous precedent by totally

circumventing the legislative process. There was no opportunity to read and provide meaningful input into the process. The legislation, as passed, would have been a great starting point for working together on an effort to address the root causes of violence and having a truly comprehensive, unified, & proactive approach. Because the Bill moved so fast and with little or no meaningful input from the public or experts in the field, there are many hidden issues that could have been tweaked to make it a good piece of legislation. I have been involved and engaged in the legislative process for over forty years and truly understand why the Founding Fathers instituted hurdles to legislation that are in place to protect our liberty...with this four day precedent, I fear the floodgates may be opened to very bad and not well-thought-through legislation.

This is why the upcoming elections may be one of the most important in our history!!! On its face, the bill will provide \$750 million to states to enact and support red flag laws and other crisis intervention programs, \$250 million in funding for community violence intervention efforts, at least \$2.35 billion for schools, and more than \$1 billion in funding for mental health programs. It would also stiffen penalties for and create a federal statute that specifically covers interstate gun trafficking and straw purchasing. Although we support efforts to keep firearms out of the hands of the "bad guys" (and to enforce the laws we already have on the books), there are many hidden One example, the legislation traps in the Bill. supposedly addresses due process with regard to incentivizing States to pass Red Flag laws, but we believe that the language is half-baked and could still allow States to ignore the vital protections granted through an individual's Constitutional Rights.

We worked tirelessly to make sure that our Indiana law contained Constitutional safeguards, but other states have bastardized the intent of the law to turn it against law-abiding citizens. Funding mechanisms within the Bill may be used to stifle and circumvent our protections under the law. There are also other "landmines" hidden in the new law (that could have been easily addressed, if the bill was not rammed without regard to the process), so we will have to be vigilant as programs are implemented. We will have to work with Senator Young and other State and Congressional leaders to make sure that the

LEGISLATIVE REPORT

The majority of Justices of the U. S. Supreme Court,

led by Justice Clarence
Thomas and Justice
Samuel Alito, vindicated
the Indiana State Rifle and
Pistol Association's
testimony before
lawmakers for many years
that the Constitution
protects the inherent right



of citizens to keep and bear arms against infringement of that right by government.

Thankfully, Indiana has had General Assembly members over the years that fought to pass legislation maximizing that right for Hoosiers.

However, as evidenced by the passage in June of the so-called "Safer Communities Act," the Democrat leadership in the U.S. Senate and House, while thanking the Republicans who supported the compromise, publicly stated that this was just one-step toward their goal of stricter control of gun owners. The anti-2nd Amendment foes in America are very well funded and organized and they will continue the attacks in city halls, statehouses, Congress, and the media throughout the country. One of their arguments for some people will be that in the 1780s, there were no AR 15s and no large magazines; what they do not seem to realize is that when free Englishmen were assured of their right to arms, it was basically the right of freemen to have the ever-improving instruments of self-defense.

To quote Joe Biden in his recent attack on the Supreme Court for upholding the Constitution, "Vote...Vote...Vote...VOTE!" In this extremely important midterm election, Hoosier gun owners need to support and *vote* for candidates who will uphold the Constitution as it was written.

Remember Thomas Jefferson's words. "No free man shall ever be debarred the use of arms."

The USCCA's Concealed Carry and Home Defense Fundamentals was a full day of training with Instructor Mark Townsend from Freedom Focus LLC in West Lafayette. The material taught in the Concealed Carry and Home Defense Fundamentals course included great information about home security, marksmanship fundamentals, firearms basics (handguns, shotguns and AR-15s), conflict avoidance and situational awareness, the physiology of violent encounters, the legal aspects of using deadly force, and what to expect in the aftermath of a self-defense or home-defense incident and much more.

Mark took the training to the next level by utilizing his Laser Shot Firearms simulator for the range time on the course. This was an amazing experience for the students, giving them a different perspective of self-defense and home defense scenarios. After the classroom portion of the CCHDF training, each student had the opportunity to shoot numerous different scenarios in the simulator. Everything from a home invasion/burglary to involvement in a violent encounter on the street can be practiced with the simulator, safely *and* saving money on ammo.

Mark and the students had great thought provoking discussions throughout the training culminating into an unforgettable virtual range experience. The firearms simulator training is a great training resource and we urge you to search out USCCA instructors, like Mark Townsend, for education and training to be better prepared for home and self-defense real world encounters. The students left the class with higher level of knowledge, understanding and confidence to help protect themselves and their loved ones.

ISRPA members enjoyed a \$25 discount on class registration. This was the first class offered as a USCCA/ISRPA partnership, but more are being planned around Indiana.
