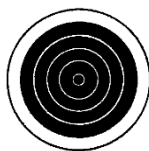

Tom Lorenzen one of the Directors from the Northeast went to his eternal reward on January 19, 2017. For over 30 years Tom ran the ISRPA Junior Rifle Match. A lifetime rifle shooter with state and national awards Tom did not forget his roots and went on to coach juniors and ensure that they had the same opportunities he had. With his infinite patience and mild manner Tom will never be forgotten by literally thousands of junior rifle shooters, smallbore shooters, and just plain ordinary people.

On March 18th I had the pleasure to attend the American Legion State Junior Air Rifle

Championship which was held at the Legion Post in Seymour. There were nine different Posts represented which fielded seventy-two young men and women. It was amazing to see so many kids in the same place at the same time competing shoulder to shoulder. What was more amazing is that there were many female shooters competing on equal basis with the male shooters. And yes the girls took home several of the awards. Awards were presented by both the American Legion itself but also by Indiana State Rifle and Pistol Association and the Indiana State Youth Shooting Sports Foundation. IYSSF put up \$2,000 to be deposited into the winning competitors' team accounts at MidwayUSA Foundation and ISRPA furnished trophies to the winners in the four different classifications.

All targets were scored using the Orion Scoring System. For those of you who are not familiar with Orion (as I was) the machine is really something. Special Orion targets (these targets are official NRA type targets) are used by the competitors and then a stack of those targets are placed into a scanner. They are then run through the machine and come out fully scored. Once collected a stack of twenty targets can be run through and scored in a matter of two minutes. The results are immediately published in the form of a match bulletin. You have to see it work to really appreciate it!

All youth shooting programs are naturally geared toward the kids, but let's not forget the adults as well. For every youth involved there are several adults involved: the parents, without their consent, support and encouragement there would be no kids shooting; the administrators, coaches, support personnel, and the

"behind the scenes" people doing everything from "soup to nuts" working together to ensure a safe, educational, and fun shooting program. All of us have a stake in this also, if we all do whatever it is that we do well to help, these programs will not die out for lack of leadership.

In Memoriam

Thomas (Tom) Lorenzen

May 11, 1957 - January 19, 2017

THOMAS MARK LORENZEN, 59, formerly of Fort Wayne, of Montpelier, was the son of June (Hollenbacher) and the late Curtis Lorenzen. He was a member of Concordia Lutheran Church, Fort Wayne and Hope Missionary Church, Bluffton. He graduated from Concordia Lutheran High School in 1975, held a B.S. in Mechanical Engineering from Purdue and an M.S. in Acoustical Engineering from Georgia Tech.

He was the owner and principal engineer of dBA Acoustics for 28 years.

Tom was a nationally ranked precision air rifle and smallbore shooter with many regional, state, and national titles, including Indiana Junior Smallbore Champion, National Air Rifle Champion and National Air Rifle team member, plus NRA Lifetime Master and Distinguished Rifleman. Tom coached the junior rifle team at Concordia High School and proudly served as the NE Indiana Director for the Indiana State Rifle and Pistol Association. He directed the Indiana State Junior Rifle Match for 31 years, receiving in 2004 the ISRPA's President's Award and a Lifetime Achievement Award in 2016 for over three decades of dedicated service.

Surviving are his loving wife, Jennifer; beloved children, Erin (Zachary) McNeil and Derek Lorenzen (fiancée Abigail Eschelbach); beloved mother, June Lorenzen. A celebration of life was held Saturday, January 28, at Hope Missionary Church in Bluffton.

LEGISLATIVE REPORT

With significant majorities of both houses of the Indiana General Assembly in the 2017 session having A+ grades from the National Rifle Association, it appeared some of the pro-Second Amendment bills which



had been sidetracked in the House in the last two sessions would have a good chance this year of becoming law. Unfortunately that did not happen.

However, Representative Woody Burton and Senator James Tones were successful in getting several favorable bills passed. Mr. Burton's bill clarified the definition of "armor-piercing" ammunition and who can manufacture, sell, and deliver it. Senator Tones' bills allow penal facility staff to have a firearm locked in their vehicle in the facility's parking lot, and professional staff of the General Assembly who possesses a license to carry will be allowed to carry a handgun in the capitol building and on the capitol complex grounds. Current information on the status of legislation, committee and session proceedings, etc. is available on the Assembly's website: www.iga.in.gov. Action on all the bills, including vote tallies on each of the bills, is on the website. Legislative activity for this session will probably conclude before April 21.

Those who would deny citizens their inherent right to keep and bear arms continue their attacks locally and nationally. It is incumbent upon gun owners who value that right to stand with their legislators and other public officials who are defending it.

Women's Corner

A good way to test and refine your shooting skills in a safe, competitive environment is to participate in a USPSA (United States Practical Shooting Association) shooting match. To learn more about USPSA competitions, I recently trained with world class USPSA shooter Ben Stoeger and his wife Kita. Ben started shooting competitively in 2005. Ben placed second 2011 IPSC Handgun World Shoot, and placed third in the 2014 IPSC Handgun World Shoot. He is also the three time IPSC US Handgun Production Champion (2012, 2013 and 2015), five time USPSA Handgun Production Champion (2011-2015). Ben also won the 2016 European Handgun Championship in Hungary.

I was interested in the role Kita played in training and had the pleasure of learning more about her. Kita worked in the Army as a mechanic, was an M60 machine gunner in the field, and earned an expert marksmanship badge on the M16 rifle. Kita said when she met Ben; she had never fired a pistol and had never heard of USPSA, so on their second date Ben took her to the range. Kita had no idea how well Ben could shoot. Kita said, never in her life had she seen anyone move and shoot a pistol as fast as Ben did! Ben taught Kita some fundamentals and complemented her on her natural accuracy, but told her if all she did was shoot accurately but slowly, nobody cared. Ben wanted her to shoot fast!

Kita joined Ben in his classes to build stages and run the timer, and picked up on things he was teaching. Kita read and edited the drafts of Ben's books for content and continued to build her knowledge base. She utilized her medical background to assist Ben in training to move efficiently and during classes for injuries on the range. Now, after years of guidance from Ben at classes, Kita said she can tell shooters what they can do better and what mistakes they have made. For example, she said it is common for women not to use all of their hand strength to grip the gun hard. But once their grip is improved, it is likely they grip so tight with their dominant hand they can't properly move their trigger finger. Another thing Kita commonly sees in women is they don't run as fast as they are capable of between shooting positions. She reminded me women DO tend to be more accurate than men and they are more precise. Kita gave this example: "think of a man vacuuming a room vs. a woman vacuuming a room...eh, that's pretty close."

Kita said she and Ben do not teach women any differently than men because it would be inherently

unfair to do so. They have the same expectation of every student, "to work hard and to improve. Man or woman, we will push you until you find the edge of your abilities. If you never find that edge, you can never cross it. You have to get outside of your comfort zone."

She said her favorite part of helping Ben with classes is when she sees someone take seconds off of their stage run by applying movement concepts she came up with herself, or because she gave them the shooting criticism they needed from all of the things she learned from Ben.



Kita stated, "it's cool to see it all come together when someone improves; it's quite rewarding. I also like building really complicated stages to mess with people. I like puzzles, and enjoy watching other people struggle to solve the puzzle I made. I know I did a good job when everyone shoots it differently, and there's no obvious right way to do it."

For women who want to start shooting USPSA, Kita suggested contacting a local club to ask for guidance. Shooters are usually very generous and want to get other people involved, especially women! Show up early and ask someone to walk you through stages to help you figure out a plan. After the match begins, watch everybody and go last. Ask questions. Of course, have a good understanding of basic range safety rules before participating in any match. USPSA has multiple divisions but production (out of the box gun) is the cheapest and probably the simplest. If you try a match and like it, then buy the gear. To figure out what is needed and the most cost effective way to get it, visit www.benstoegerproshop.com.

USPSA is a definitely a fun and safe way to practice and learn skills. I am grateful for the lessons learned from both Ben and Kita Stoeger!

INDIANA STATE JUNIOR RIFLE CHAMPIONSHIPS PURDUE UNIVERSITY, ROTC ARMORY WEST LAFAYETTE MARCH 11-12

Once again, the second weekend of March filled the Purdue University armory with an exciting buzz. For more than sixty years junior rifle shooters have competed in the Indiana State Rifle Championships. On March 11th and 12th, 196 young rifle shooters from around the state participated in four different disciplines for state champion title honors. Shooters represented eleven programs, including high school and private organizations. Ben Davis was new to the match but still placed an impressive 2nd in Sporter Air. This year's individual sporter champion was a 7th grader from the Belmont Rifle program. We look forward to seeing what this young man is capable of in years to come. No new records were set this year but Rhianna Gary of the Marion High School AJROTC program tied the state sporter standing record with a score of 171-1 as her team took the Sporter title. Bishop Dwenger continued its winning ways taking home two titles, Smallbore and International Air. Relative newcomer, Carroll High School, won its first state title in only its second year of competition edging out defending champion Bishop Dwenger in 3P Precision Air.

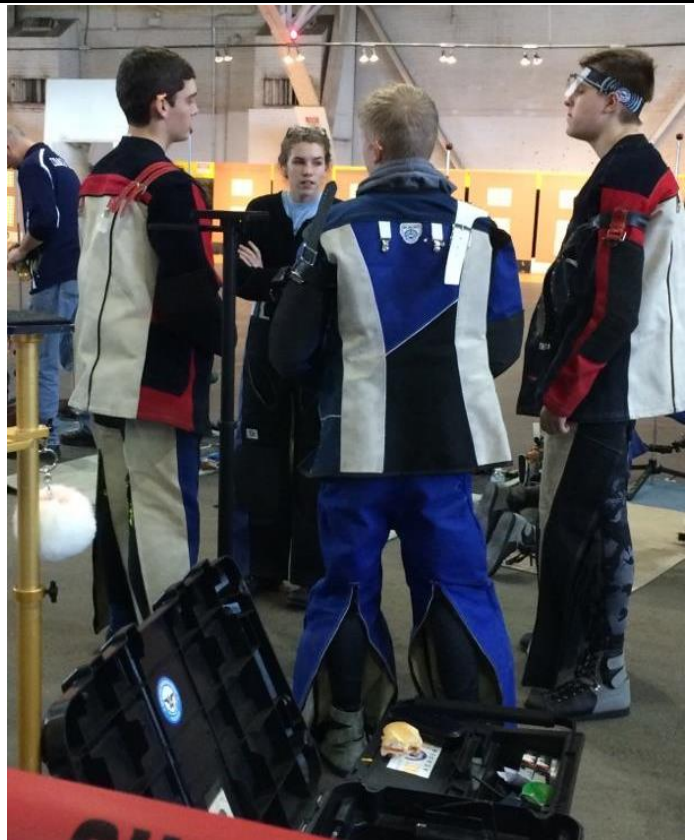

The Latest on Sarah Beard

*Rifle Shooter/ISRPA Life Member Sarah Beard
Joins Army's WCAP Program

After several years of recruiting efforts by the U.S. Army, Sarah Beard, Danville, has finally succumbed to the call of duty. In early February of this year, Beard enlisted in the U.S. Army Reserve in preparation for joining the Army's World Class Athlete Program (WCAP). She immediately reported to Ft. Jackson, SC to begin the Army Basic Combat Training (BCT) course. She has reportedly been yelled at repeatedly by her Drill Sergeants (DS's) for smiling too much! She was counseled by her uncle, who was Company Commander of a Basic Training company during his Army days, to keep a low profile and blend in well with her platoon-mates. This went well until the rifle qualification phase, when she was the first to get zeroed, and the DS's began bringing her six more rifles to sight in. Then when she hit 40 out of 40 on the qualification course (out to 300 meters), a DS pulled her aside and began questioning her about her career path. She was found out! (Beard has been a resident athlete at the U.S. Olympic Training Center for the last four years, narrowly missing an Olympic Team berth, won two team NCAA Rifle Championships while attending Texas Christian University, was named All-American all four years, has won multiple individual USA Shooting National Championships, is a two-time medalist at the Pan Am Games, and has been in numerous finals in World Cup competition where she won the only 2016 Olympic slot for the U.S. in the Air Rifle event – the event that Ginny Thrasher won Gold in for the U.S.)

She now has the nickname "Hawkeye" in the platoon, and the meanest DS has asked to have their picture taken together on graduation day! She related in a letter that it's amazing what a difference a few well-placed bullets can do for you – especially if you're a soldier!

After BCT, Beard goes directly to Ft. Benning, GA to attend Officer Candidate School. She hopes to have enough free time to meet up with her teammate from TCU, Erin (Lorenzen) McNeil, who is a member of the U.S. Army Marksmanship Unit located at Ft. Benning. Erin's father is recently deceased Tom Lorenzen, a long time ISRPA Board Member from Ft. Wayne. Beard has asked her Dad, ISRPA Director Bill Beard, if he could find time in his retired

schedule to come down to Georgia and commission her as a Second Lieutenant upon graduation from OCS. His only reply: "Are you kidding me!?"



After OCS, Beard will then attend the Basic Officers Course for the Military Police Branch at Ft. Leonard Wood, MO. Upon completion of this, she will return to Colorado Springs, where an Army Reserve MP unit is holding an officer slot for her. As a member of WCAP, her full time duty assignment will be training for the next Olympic Games at the OTC. In addition to insuring that participants remain competitive with their military counterparts assigned to regular Army units, the WCAP program also supports the U.S. Army Recruiting Command mission, provides an image of excellence for all soldiers to strive for, and provides positive role models for peer groups and youth while enhancing the public's pride in America's Armed Forces.

USA Shooting Announces Eleven Indiana Athletes As Junior Olympians

Fort Wayne—On January 7th, The X Count hosted the 2017 Indiana Junior Olympic Regional Competition for Rifle and Pistol. More than 50 athletes from three states converged upon the facility to attempt to qualify for the Junior Olympics. Athletes qualify for the Junior Olympics automatically by being a state champion in their discipline or by achieving a predetermined automatic qualifier. In addition, a cut score for each discipline is determined after all scores are compiled nationally. Athletes from around the state were named as qualifiers:

John Yarde - Bishop Dwenger - Men's 10 Meter Air / Men's Smallbore, Veronica Buczak - Bishop Dwenger - Women's 10 Meter Air, Ava Kennedy - Bishop Dwenger - Women's Smallbore, Corey Schreiber - Carroll High School - Men's 10 Meter Air, Ben Butler - Carroll Middle School - Men's 10 Meter Air, Isaiah Cole - Bellmont High School - Men's 10 Meter Air, Alex Hoover - Culver Academy - Men's 10 Meter Air, Rachel McCartney - Purdue Rifle and Pistol - Women's Air Pistol, Gabriella Raisor - Greenfield 4H - Women's Air Pistol, Gavin Carrico - Greenfield 4H - Men's Air Pistol, Noah Stover - Purdue Rifle and Pistol Club - Men's Air Pistol

Qualifying athletes will travel to the Olympic Training Center in Colorado Springs April 7-27 to compete in their qualifying discipline. Bellmont high school and the city of Decatur are celebrating their first Junior Olympian in the program's storied history. The return of the Culver Academy's rifle program and the new Carroll programs are only two years old but both were excited to qualify athletes. Purdue University and the strong Greenfield 4H programs will again be represented in pistol. The goal of the Junior Olympic program is to allow skilled junior athletes to obtain national competitive experience for future development and to provide an opportunity for the top finishers to serve on the National Junior Team.

The Endeavor Games provide opportunities for children, adults, and military service members with disabilities the opportunity to display their talent in a competitive setting. The first Endeavor Games were held in 2000, on the Campus of the University of Central Oklahoma. In 2016, the Endeavor Games set a record in athlete participation, boasting 310 athletes from 38 states and Puerto Rico. Due to its growth and popularity the Endeavor Games Series will begin in 2017 as it comes to Indiana. The Turnstone Endeavor Games will be held in Fort Wayne. This new event site will feature seven sports including air rifle. The air rifle competition and clinic will be held at The X Count. Clinics will be held on Friday, April 21st while the competitions will take place on Saturday, April 22nd. Novice athletes will compete in the morning while the more competitive athletes compete in the afternoon.

The partnership between The X Count and Turnstone Center for Children and Adults with Disabilities is not a new one. The two organizations have been working together for the last year hosting the Adaptive Sports USA Veteran's Air Gun Series. The X Count began its work with adaptive athletes in 2014 hosting the first adaptive shooter in the Indiana State Junior Rifle Championship in 2015. This experience created an inevitable partnership between the two organizations. Now, both organizations and the participating athletes will benefit. The Endeavor Games Series will be the first large event that will showcase the acquisition of the Megalink targets from the CMP. Competitors and fans alike will enjoy this experience.

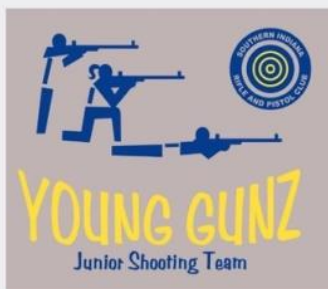
