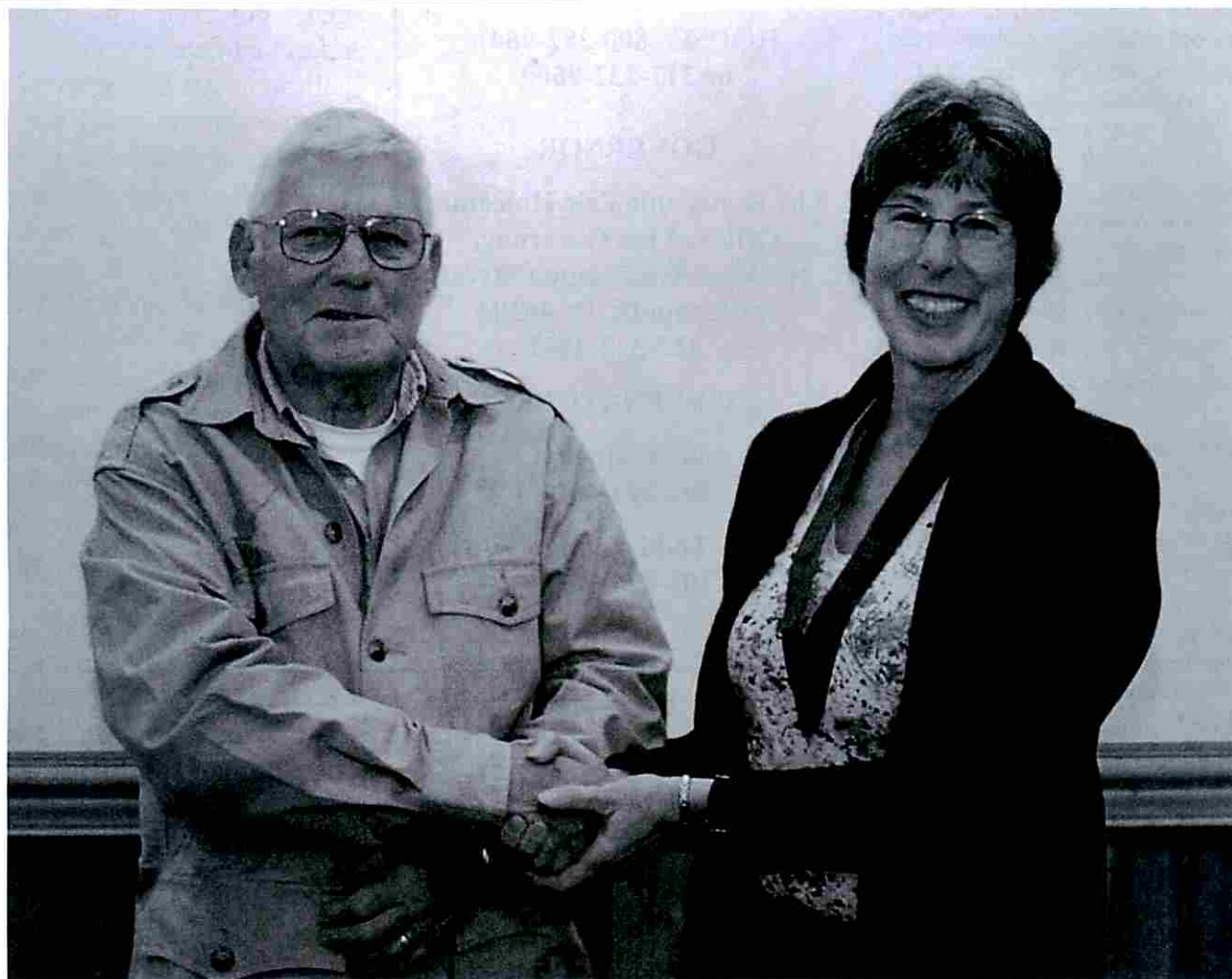

- New web-site-thanks to the efforts of Sue Mogle and Charlie Hiltunen.
- New postal match for Junior shooters-thanks to the efforts of Paul Carlson, Bill Jordan and Steve Pardieck. The match program is being distributed at this very time.
- A successful booth at the NRA Convention in Louisville, KY-thanks to the efforts of several people who gave of their time and effort to ensure that the booth was manned throughout the entire show.
- A Col Charles Wilhelm Memorial Trophy-which will be awarded to the high state Junior Pistol Shooter at the annual awards banquet.
- The election of a 3 Gun Vice-President-Steve Pardieck, the present ISRPA Pistol VP has volunteered to take the position until he can recruit someone else to fill the position. 3 Gun is a

new discipline as far as ISRPA is concerned and it consists of competition where rifles, pistols, and shotguns are used.

- Although this effort was led by NRA, ISRPA namely with Charlie Hiltunen acting as liaison, was involved in the discussions concerning the decision to move the National High Power Championships from Camp Perry, Ohio to Camp Atterbury, IN in 2017.

These are some of the activities that the officers, directors, and members were successful in either bringing to fruition or at least starting the activities in that direction. But we can't rest on our haunches and figure all is well, because if we do then we will start going downhill.

Hopefully somehow, and I'm not sure just how to accomplish this, all of them can be brought under some sort of umbrella group overseen by ISRPA's Women of the ISRPA VP Linda Levan. I'm sure that amongst all our talented women they can come up with a way to do it.

If we can all pull together to accomplish this, it will certainly make 2017 a very successful year.

General Scholarship

This scholarship was established by the ISRPA as a tool for assisting in the education of a person pursuing any line of studies.

“The general scholarship is open to applicants active in the shooting sports be they a Junior Member of the Association or son or daughter of an Association Member. No restrictions will be placed on the area of study the individual is pursuing”.

John E. Hatfull Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship was established by the ISRPA to honor the memory of SGT. John E. Hatfull, an Indiana State Trooper, who was killed in the line of duty in 1988. John was not only an ISRPA member he was also an avid, and a very accomplished pistol competitor.

“This scholarship is restricted to individuals studying in the areas of law enforcement, conservation, coaching, or areas of sports medicine, or is a competitive shooter. The applicant must be a member, or be related to a member of the Association.”

Applicants

All applications must include a letter of request and a transcript of studies from the last year of studies. In the case of high school graduates applying prior to the starting of college, a transcript of high school studies is sufficient. Applications must be received by March 1st of any given year and awards will be decided at the mid-year Board of Directors meeting. 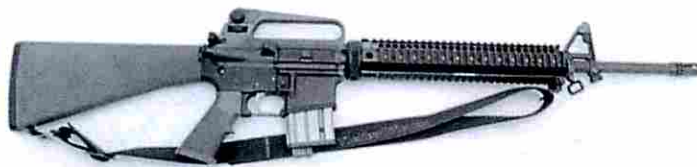
NRA National High Power Rifle Championships Coming to Camp Atterbury in July

Dennis Willing, director of NRA Competitive Shooting announced in November that the NRA National High Power Rifle Championships will be moved to Camp Atterbury, Indiana beginning in July 2017, pending approval by the NRA Board of Directors in January, 2017.



"The NRA High Power Rifle Committee met and determined it would be beneficial to all competitors if we moved the Championships from Camp Perry to another site. After much discussion, the range at Camp Atterbury, IN, was selected as the new home of the NRA National High Power Rifle Championships." Willing added, "I intend to change the face of High Power Rifle as a discipline, and will be presenting matches that are better than competitors have ever seen before."



There were many factors involved in the decision to move the National Championships from Camp Perry, and many more in the selection of a suitable range. In November the selection had been narrowed to three potential sites, and ISRPA Officers Jerry Wehner, Bill Beard, and Sue Mogle met with the NRA High Power Committee at Camp Atterbury to assist with the final selection. The Camp Atterbury Joint Maneuver Training Center, administered by the Indiana National Guard, has approximately 35,000 acres of state-of-the-art training and maneuver space, which could potentially allow for expansion beyond the High Power Rifle Championships. Centrally located, it is easily accessible by interstate and close to airports in

both Indianapolis and Louisville for those travelling by air.

Camp Atterbury offers many options for affordable, comfortable housing both on and off base as well as options for food and beverages. ISRPA officers are working with Camp Atterbury, the NRA and local vendors for packages to expand options for individuals and teams for housing and other amenities. For family members that are not shooting there is a swimming pool, camping and a playground on base. The Outlet Mall at nearby Taylorsville offers shopping, and there are many vacation destinations within an hour or so of Camp Atterbury.

For shooters needing to test equipment or loads, sight in rifles, or just wanting a little practice or recreational shooting the Atterbury Shooting Complex, operated on DNR fish and wildlife land located just outside the base, is open to the public offering ranges out to 100 yards for pistol, rifle and shotgun, and a Pro Shop. Look for more information as the season progresses!

The proposed match schedule (*subject to change*) is below:

- First Shot Ceremony - July 7**
- Welcome BBQ (afternoon) - July 7**
- Across the Course - July 8-13**
- Mid-Range - July 14-17**
- Long-Range - July 18-22**

Since Across the Course is scheduled to end on July 13th, there will be sufficient time for competitors to attend the CMP National Trophy Matches.

The NRA Smallbore Prone Championship is scheduled to end with sufficient time for competitors to leave Bristol, IN, and come to Camp Atterbury to compete in Mid-Range Prone and Long-Range Prone. The NRA National Pistol Championship will remain at Camp Perry but will be held July 9-14, following previous year's practice.

They are #1 because they all helped build the Falls of the Ohio committee and their vision of helping our youth shooting sports.

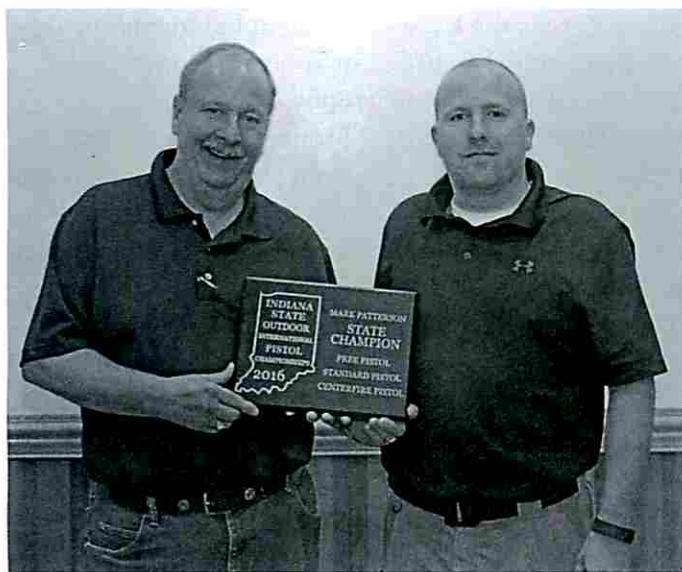

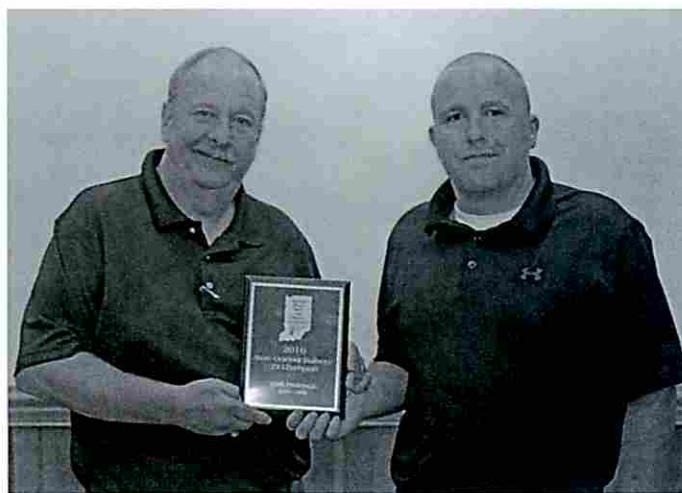

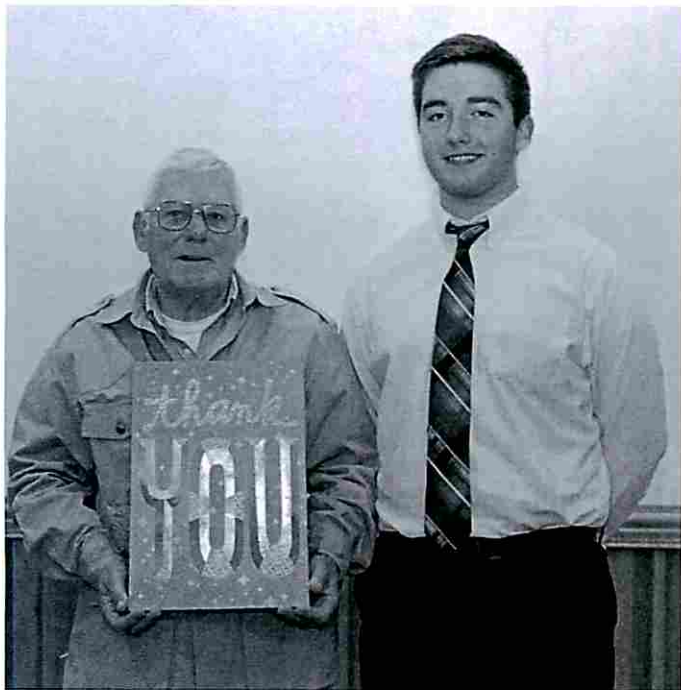

ISRPA SPONSORED POSTAL MATCHES

To promote shooting competition among competitors of all ages, especially junior shooters in an inexpensive and friendly environment (home range), the ISRPA encourages shooters to participate in our new postal competition program. Our primary goal is to increase awareness and introduce junior shooters to different shooting programs, and we hope that we can expand to shooters of all ages in the future. A postal match allows shooters to shoot labeled targets provided by us at their own ranges and ship the targets to us for scoring. Shooting disciplines available include international air rifle and air pistol, 3P sporter air rifle, 3P precision air rifle, conventional pistol (indoor), small bore rifle, international free pistol, and BB gun.

The program will include two sessions: January 1 – May 31 and June 1 – October 31 with awards for each session and for the two sessions combined.

While we will eventually need to charge a fee to cover expenses, for this inaugural year, your only cost will be postage to ship targets to the ISRPA. Matches must be fired on targets provided by the ISRPA in a facility that is safe and designed for the specific shooting event. All rules for the discipline, including equipment, are to be followed per NRA, USA Shooting or other appropriate governing body for the discipline. We will divide shooters by age, types of shooting program, etc. to balance the competition as best we can.

Please talk with your local 4-H shooting groups, American Legion Junior Shooting Programs, gun clubs, etc. to encourage them to take advantage of this new program to encourage junior competition shooting. 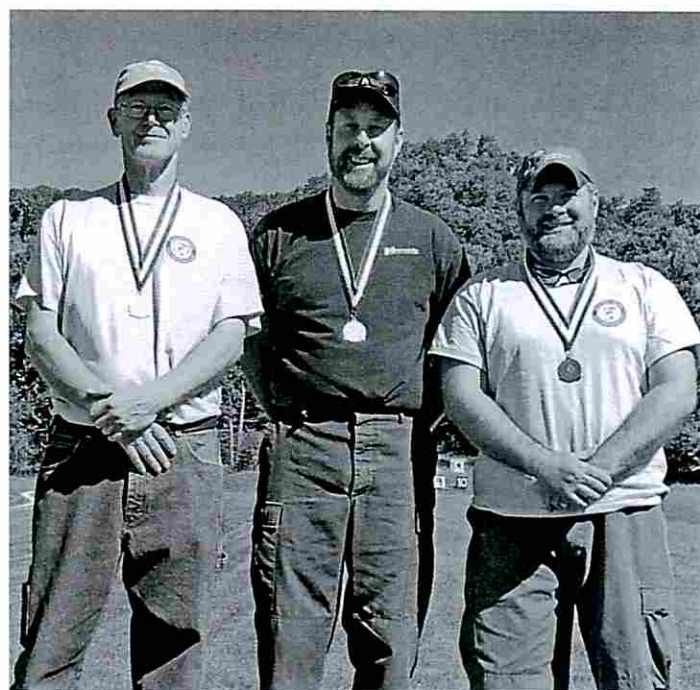

LEGISLATIVE REPORT

After eight years of anti - 2nd Amendment ideology in Washington, the 2016 election brought great news to law abiding gun owners across America. Both Donald Trump and Mike Pence campaigned as strong



supporters of an individual right to keep and bear arms. Hoosier sportsmen were well aware of Governor Pence's commitment to that right as well as his personal enjoyment of the shooting sports.

Here in Indiana, sportsmen also saw a state administration elected that continues the legacy of hunting, fishing and the shooting sports. Hoosiers elected Lt. Governor Holcomb to succeed Governor Pence. Governor Holcomb and his wife, the First Lady of Indiana, are just as committed to the individual right to keep and bear arms as now Vice-President Pence.

Hoosiers also elected/re-elected strong supporters of the 2nd Amendment to our General Assembly. All 100 seats in the House of Representatives were on the ballot. Of the 70 Republicans and 30 Democrats elected, 68 were given "A" ratings by the National Rifle Association. Twenty-five of the Senate seats were up for election. Of the 19 Republicans and 6 Democrats elected, 19 were given "A" ratings by the NRA.

The General Assembly is now in session with an adjournment date of April 29. The website www.iga.in.gov provides access to most of the information you would want: session and committee dates; legislator's names by alphabet and district numbers; bills introduced by number, legislator, or subject; action and status of all the bills, etc.

Of the bills proposed in the Senate and House, there are several of particular interest to gun owners. In the senate, SB78 introduced by Senator Jack Sandlin from Indianapolis would provide that a person attending a worship service using a school facility would not be prohibited from lawfully carrying a firearm. Senator Jim Tomes' SB 14 would allow staff members of the Legislature to carry lawfully possessed firearms into the Statehouse. Also, Senator Tomes' SB 43 would allow guards at state penal

facilities to have firearms locked in their vehicles in the parking lot while on duty.

In the House, Representative Jim Lucas is the author of HB 1159, which is generally referred to as "constitutional carry." In the past few years several states have passed such a law, basically saying the state government should not require a citizen who lawfully possesses a handgun to get permission to carry in his home state. A person would still have to obtain an Indiana license to carry when going to a state with which Indiana has license reciprocity. Mr. Lucas is also the author of HB 1258, which would prohibit a regional campus of a state educational institution from imposing a rule or policy that prohibits or limits the legal carrying, possession, or transportation of a firearm while on land or in a building at the state educational institution.

The full text, authors and sponsors, actions, and hearings of these mentioned bills, as well as all other bills, can be accessed at the www.iga.in.gov website.

Remember that there are many anti-gun groups who do not agree with the Founders of our Nation and our State that your right to keep and bear arms without infringement does not come from government – it is an inherent individual right as a free citizen of a free land. Let your State Senator and State Representative know that you appreciate their standing up for the 2nd Amendment.

Shoot With Janet

Camp Atterbury, Indiana January 7

Officers of the Indiana State Rifle and Pistol Association were on site at Camp Atterbury January 7 for incoming First Lady Janet Holcomb's "Shoot With Janet" event sponsored by the Indiana National Guard Association. The event featured an opportunity to "meet and greet" Governor-Elect Eric Holcomb and First Lady Janet Holcomb and showcased some of the state of the art training available in Indiana at Camp Atterbury. Our incoming First Lady Janet is a certified NRA instructor and avid hunter. Both Eric and Janet are solid Second Amendment supporters.

The event was free and open to the public. Tickets were available on a first come first serve basis, with a limit of 250 attending. The "Shoot and Shoot" offered a choice of shooting with Janet on Saturday, or shooting hoops with Eric on Sunday. Saturday's event began with the Pledge of Allegiance. "Gun Guy" Guy Relford introduced Eric and Janet Holcomb following a brief introduction to Camp Atterbury and its training platforms by Gen. Carr and Lt. Col. Gardner. Participants had an opportunity to use a number of virtual weapon training platforms, the same used to train our men and women in uniform. No live ammunition was used: the weapons are equipped with lasers that are designed to "hit" the virtual targets to simulate the behavior of each particular weapon system and caliber. These weapon programs are military grade and have the look and feel of real military weapons allowing realistic training without the use of live ammo. They are both more cost effective and safer for many training scenarios. And on a day that started out at 7 degrees above zero, we were glad to have a climate-controlled environment!

Participants also had the opportunity to try their hand at "driving" a military vehicle on a "mission" to "deliver water and MRE's to a forward position in Afghanistan" using the Reconfigurable Vehicle

Simulator. This 360 degree virtual environment features four vehicles—in this case HMMVW "Humvees"—equipped with various military grade weapons systems simulators. The system participants used Saturday could accommodate up to 20 at a time in four "vehicles" that were able to communicate with each other on the "mission" and also "see" the other vehicles simulated on the 360 degree screen as they progressed through the exercise. The system is so realistic that we felt the "bump" and heard the grinding crash when our driver overshot a turn and hit

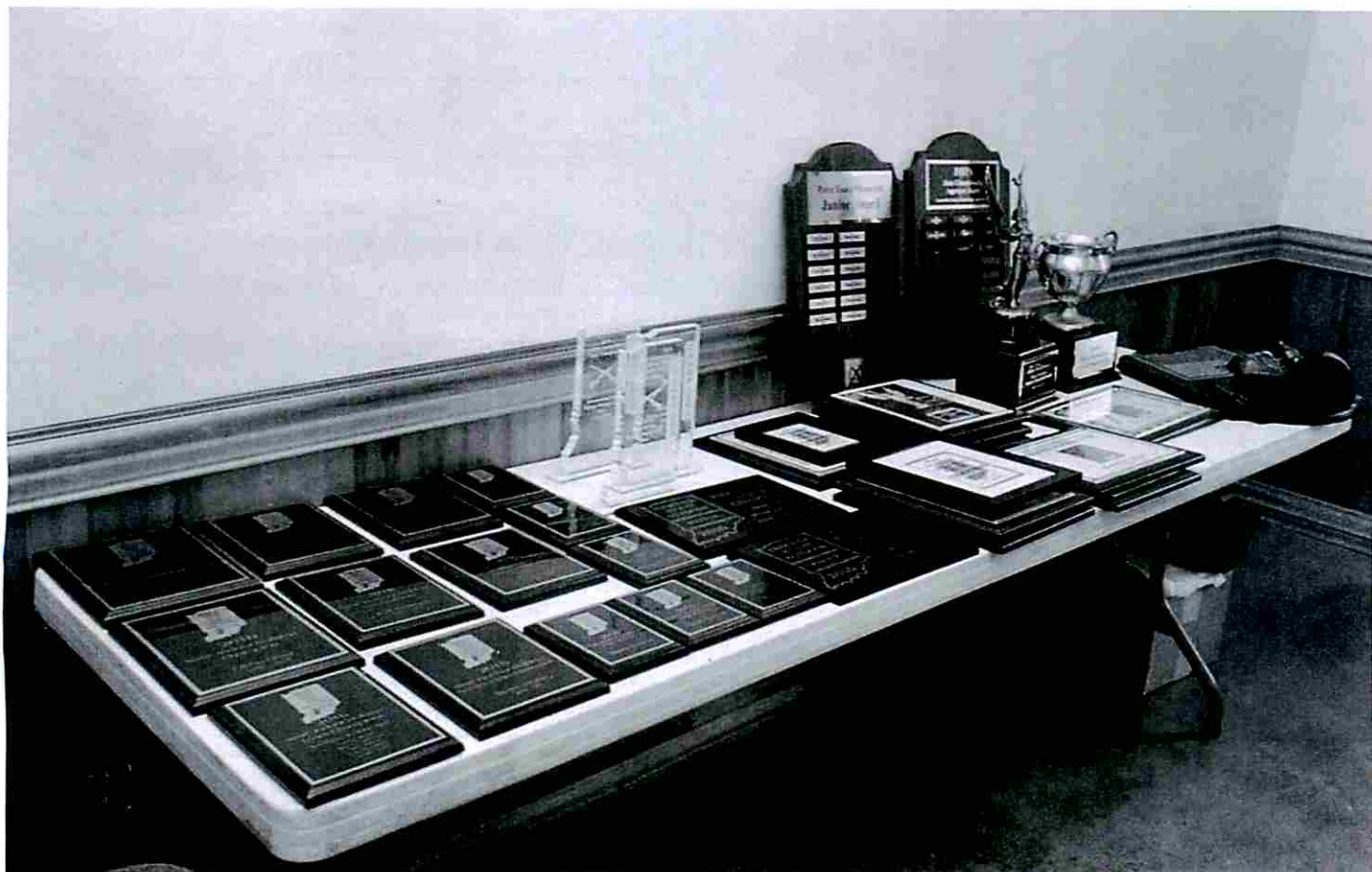
