ISRPA was well represented this summer at the Legislators Day held at Camp Atterbury. The event was held August 30<sup>th</sup> and all Legislators regardless of party affiliation were invited. Attendees and their wives/husbands were given a bus tour of the camp and then dropped off at the shooting ranges set up solely for their use. There was a silhouette range for the pistol shooters and three different targets for rifle shooting. There were three different rifles that people could shoot including a 50 cal. Barrett. The pistol range was equipped with Glock 9mm pistols and anyone who wished was allowed to fire two 10 round magazines. There were probably a dozen handguns available and there was an instructor assigned to each gun who took care of loading and demonstrating the proper procedure for firing. It was on this range that Sue Mogle, Charlie Hiltunen and his two sons, Brian and Chad and I worked. The event started at 10 AM and went until about 3 PM. Midway through, lunch was served for everyone and all were given a

"goodie bag" which contained ear muffs, shooting glasses and a variety of other things including a copy of the ISSN and an ISRPA tri-fold. No personal firearms were allowed, and everything, ammo and lunch included, was free. Several of the participants had never shot a hand gun before and one woman especially was very apprehensive of the whole situation, but once she completed firing she was all smiles.

Events like this are important because they show people that firearms, with proper instruction, can be most enjoyable to shoot. There were many shooting related businesses from around the state that joined forces to put on the event and thanks to the efforts of Charlie, ISRPA was listed as an event sponsor in lieu of Charlie himself being listed. Another big thanks to Charlie Hiltunen!!

Just recently Grace College in Winona Lake formed a Shotgun Club. The Club has the full approval of the school administration and the Board of Trustees. At the present time the focus will be on trap shooting but the hope is that if suitable funding can be appropriated, the program will be expanded to rimfire shooting. This whole venture did not develop "overnight". If I understand it right a couple of years ago a shooting event was scheduled at the Warsaw Rifle and Pistol Club where students and faculty members were invited to come out and shoot. Firearms and ammunition was furnished and the intent of the event was to show that guns, properly and safely used, are not bad in and of themselves. Talking and planning began then to make a school shooting program a reality.

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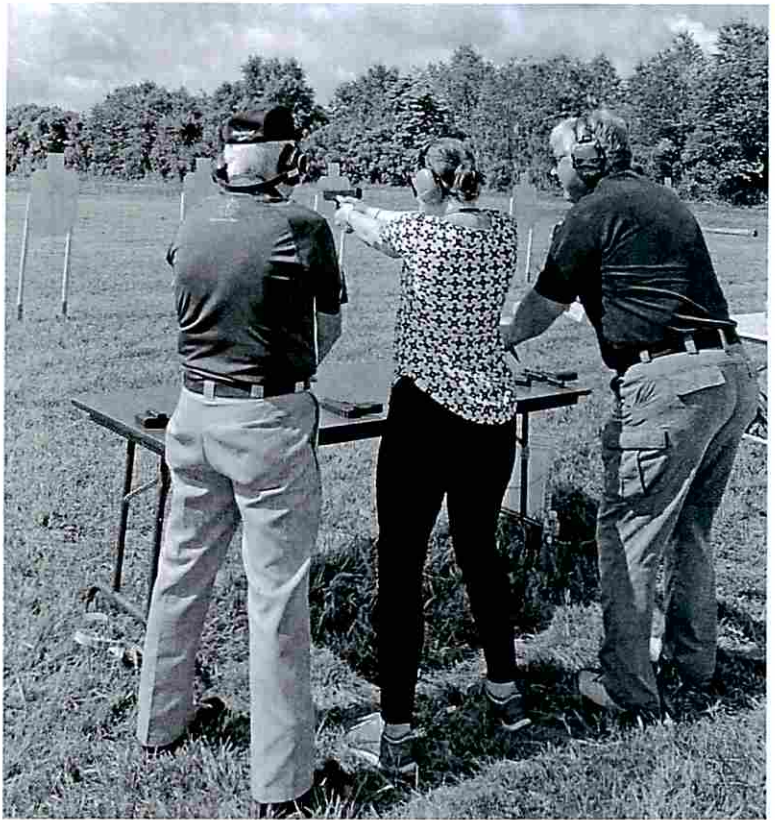

# LEGISLATIVE REPORT

In this critical election year, it is important for liberty-loving ISRPA members to know where the individual candidates stand on the issue of our inherent right to keep and bear arms.



The October issue of "American Rifleman" has the grades and endorsements of candidates running for offices at the State and National level. This doesn't cover the issue of where the Democrat and Republican parties stand on your constitution-protected right. In due respect to third parties, the platforms of the two major parties are the ones which will be the guide for the elected officials. Many Hoosiers can remember when both of those parties fully supported the individual's right; but much has changed in recent years.

Indiana specific information can be obtained about the candidates and the upcoming election on various websites such as: [www.iga.in.gov](http://www.iga.in.gov) for information on the General Assembly; [www.in.gov/SOS/elections](http://www.in.gov/SOS/elections) for dates of elections and candidate information. Also, the NRA candidate information can be obtained at [www.nrapvf](http://www.nrapvf).

Please support the candidates who will not only say they "support the 2<sup>nd</sup> Amendment," but also commit publicly that they will not support ANY legislation which infringes on your right.

Senator Brent Steele was successful in guiding through two sessions of the General Assembly the resolution which will preserve the right to hunt and fish of all Hoosiers and their posterity through an amendment to our state constitution. ***On your ballot this year will be Question 1, which, if the majority of those voting vote "yes," will provide that the right to hunt, fish, and harvest wildlife shall be forever preserved for the public good.*** Those of us who have taken that Hoosier legacy for granted owe to our children and grandchildren the assurance, as some twenty other states have already done, that they will not be denied that opportunity.

As Minnesota Senator Hubert Humphrey said in October, 1959: "...one of the chief guarantees of freedom... is the right of citizens to keep and bear arms..."

***Freedom is not and never has been free.***

## ***"Right to Hunt and Fish"***

*Below is a letter from Indiana State Senator Brent Steele. Sen. Steele has worked very hard over the past two years and more to get this on our November ballot. This has been a grueling showdown between the state and the very powerful HSUS (Humane Society of United States) who have enormous financial reserves to attempt to restrict the sport of hunting in Indiana and elsewhere.*

Hello. My name is Brent Steele, Bedford, Indiana, and Republican Senator for District 44. I have sent an email to my good friend Senator Jim Tomes, to forward to his email friends who support the Second Amendment and hunting. For many years we worked hard to get the ***"Right to Hunt and Fish"*** guaranteed by our State Constitution. Fourteen other states have taken the precaution, thirteen of which, like Indiana, have done it recently, and Vermont having done it in 1777.

## ***Be Sure to Vote***

If you live in Indiana, that issue will be on your ballot this November. Please be prepared to support it. People ask, why do we need to make it a Constitutional right? If you could see how many animal rights organizations are out there chipping away at this right through local county ordinances, you would not question it. These organizations raise millions. They hire high powered lawyers to sue. A lawyer myself, I know that they will spend millions in Indiana to defeat this ballot initiative.

Be prepared to stand up and be heard. Let people know that hunting is a part of our Hoosier Heritage not to mention it is recognized by the DNR as the most efficient way to control over population of certain species. Hunting and fishing pumps millions of dollars into the Hoosier economy every year in sales of equipment, hotel rooms, fees, sales taxes on equipment, just to mention a few. # Women's Corner

## Distracting Questions

We were taught to be polite to strangers and helpfulness was an expectation. But times have changed. We must be continuously aware of our surroundings, including those seemingly nice strangers who strike up a conversation. A recent article entitled "Distraction Questions" written by Greg Ellifritz addresses the three most common questions criminals use to distract and get closer to a victim. Greg's article is published here with his permission.



"In order for a criminal to get close enough to commit his crime, he has to appear non-threatening. If he appears dangerous, his "prey" is likely to spot him earlier and either run away or call for help. Hence, the criminal will close the distance, often using the pretense of asking a question to appear less threatening.

The same questions seem to get asked over and over again. Criminals use them because they work. Read the story linked below. Here's one such example of a distracting question used to facilitate the commission of a crime:

Victim in Vicious Assault Speaks out about the Attack (<http://www.khq.com/story/19554201/khq-exclusive-victim-in-vicious-assault-speaks-out-about-the-attack>)

In this incident, the attacker asked the victim for the time. According to the article:

"Debbie Watkins was out on the Centennial Trail near her home Thursday afternoon, when she walked by a man she didn't know, who asked her for the time. When she was getting out her phone to answer, he attacked."

"When I saw him raise his hand, at first I was like this is not happening. I have never had anything like this happen in my life."

Asking for the time is one of the most common distracting questions a criminal uses. It serves dual purposes. Not only does it provide justification for the attacker to get closer to the victim, it also causes

the victim to momentarily look away to check the time. The criminal will use that moment to attack.

In my research, I've found two other very commonly used distracting questions. They are:

- 1) Asking for directions
- 2) Asking for a cigarette or lighter

Many criminals will use some version of these three questions when targeting an adult victim. Criminals who prey on children tend to ask different questions. They target the child's desire to help an adult by asking for assistance with something. Questions like "Can you help me find my lost dog" are more commonly used.

The best response to such questions is to say something like "I'm sorry. I can't help you." as you quickly walk away. Don't stay around and debate. Be firm and be ready to escalate both vocally and physically if your response doesn't cause him to stop his approach.

Your homework assignment this week is to come up with good responses to the three most common distracting questions used by criminals. Once you determine your responses, role play them with a spouse or friend. Have your partner make an approach and ask one of the questions. Make your response and execute your escape plan. It won't take many repetitions to ingrain these responses into your verbal repertoire."

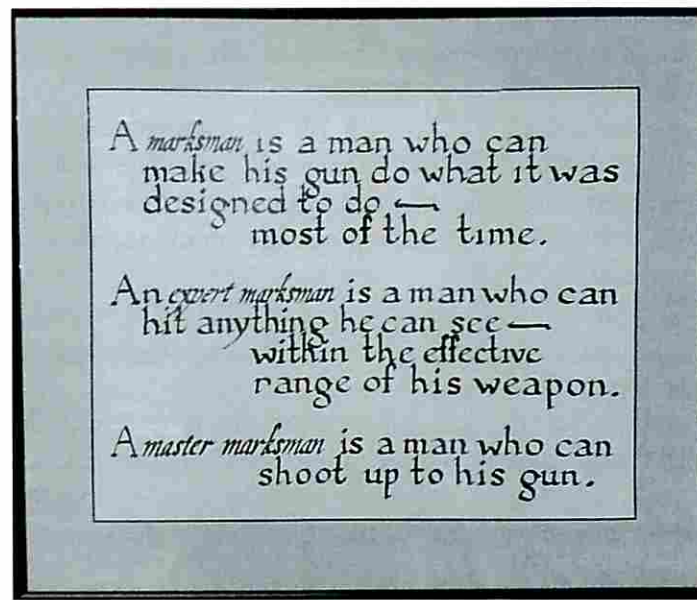
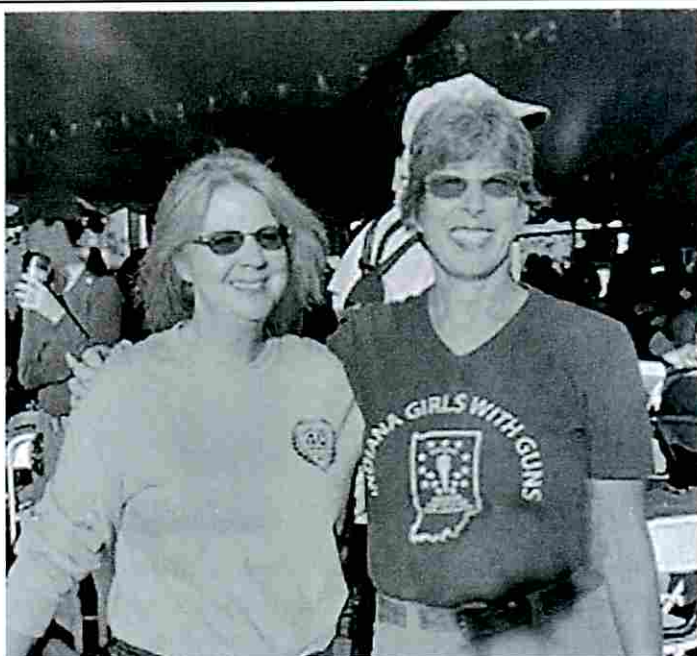

Gunsite, then known as the American Pistol Institute, was founded by Jeff Cooper in 1976 about twenty miles north of Prescott in the high Sonoran desert. Originally built on 250 acres, Gunsite's operation now covers 4.5 square miles. Located in rolling hills at 5000 feet, there's a great deal of history, and much to see in and around Prescott, the original Capital of the Arizona Territory. Lunch and barbecue dinner were served under the tent by local vendors, and the party after the match featured samples from Gunsite vendors and awards for the top three shooters, junior and senior. In the Cooper tradition, the middle shooter won the Gunsite Service Pistol. There was more than one gun to win at each side match also. Linda and several other Indiana folks spent the week prior to the match at one of the many classes that were offered ahead of the Alumni shoot. 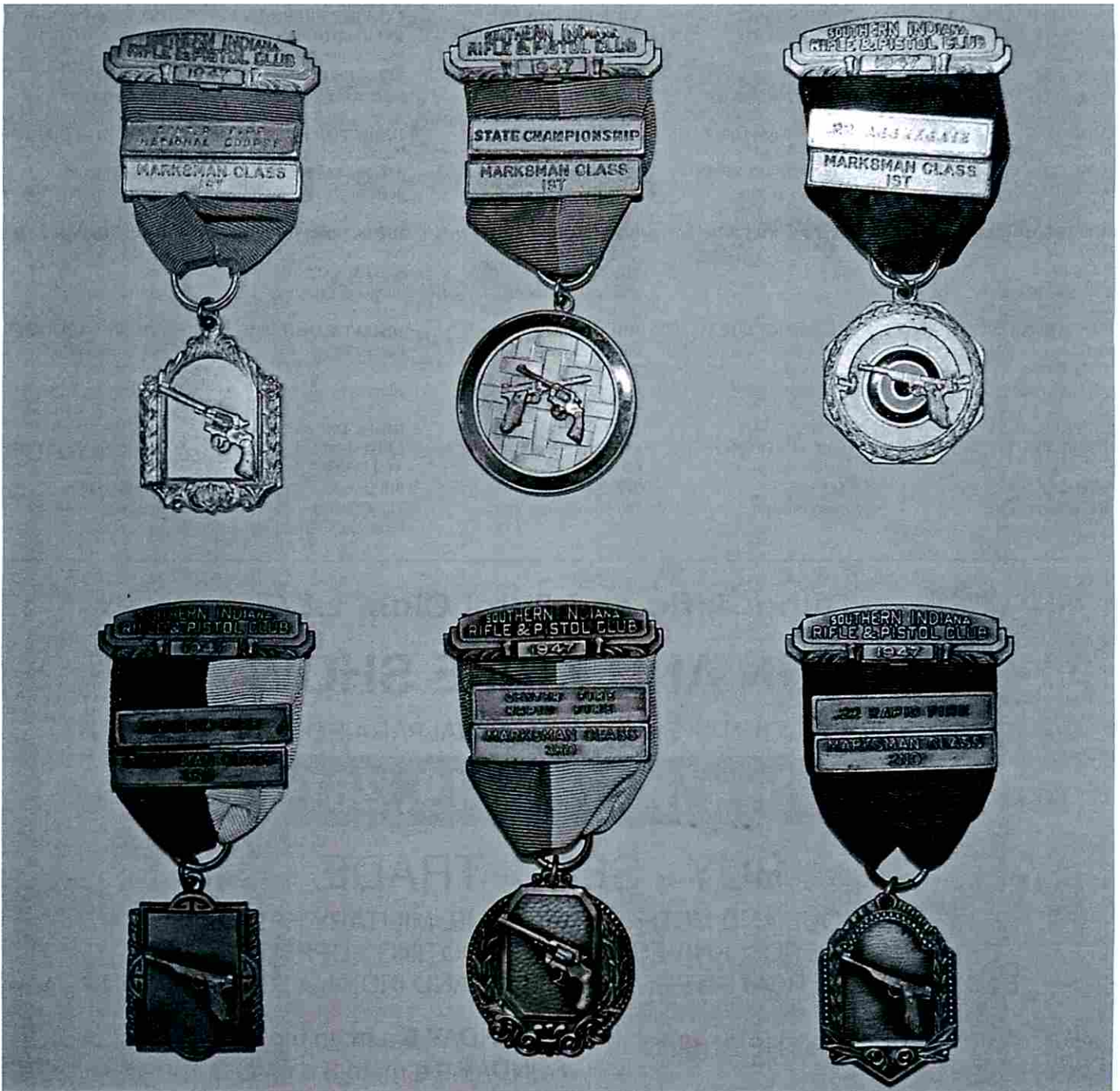
